PARENT CARER SUPPORT

We have a range of opportunities for Bolton parents and carers who would like to understand more about neurodiversity, including autism and ADHD. The sessions are aimed where there is no diagnosis in place.




They are aimed at families who are curious to learn about neurodiversity, and exploring what this might mean for their child. They offer valuable advice, helpful tips, and support for your family.

Sessions are held in small groups, providing parents and carers the chance to connect with other families facing similar experiences.

Our sessions are delivered by staff and volunteers from The Compass Partnership, all whom are parents or carers of children and young people with neurodevelopmental conditions.

WORKSHOPS



Curious about Autism

The content has been designed for parents and carers whose child does not have an autism diagnosis. Our workshop is designed to give parents and carers a clear and supportive overview of autism and wider Neurodevelopmental conditions. The session offers practical strategies, hints and tips to support you, with a focus on what can help in day-to-day life.



Exploring Sensory Differences

This workshop explores sensory differences across the neurodevelopmental spectrum. Whilst often associated with autism, sensory differences are experienced across many neurodevelopmental conditions. You will gain insight into the sensory world and learn practical ways to better understand and support your child in everyday life.



Curious about ADHD

The content has been designed for parents and carers whose child does not have an ADHD diagnosis. Our workshop is designed to give parents and carers a clear and supportive overview of ADHD and wider Neurodevelopmental conditions. The session offers practical strategies, hints and tips to support you, with a focus on what can help in day-to-day life.

GROUP SESSIONS

These sessions are topic based: Eating, Sleeping and Toileting. A little different to the workshops, these sessions will still have an element of learning how and why neurodevelopmental conditions affect these areas, but they will also be an opportunity to chat with other parents in an understanding space.
